The Block-Heads by Jason

We've come a long way in our first couple of months with the block making machine! We've found a good source for the right kind of dirt, learned how to make buildings in a new way, and made about 12,000 4"x6"x12" blocks! Our first test project was a small medical building for basic wound treatment here at the youth center. Then, we went out to Mansoa to produce blocks for the meeting pavilion at the new agricultural and discipleship center that our teammates the McHargues are pioneering. Then, we came back to Bissau and set to work building our shop. So far we've laid about 5,000 blocks, with another 3,000 ready to be laid.

Please pray for us as the next several months will be very busy ones. The rainy season will start in mid-May, and all construction work outside will stop. By then, all of our various building projects will need to be roofed and plastered on the outside or the rain storms will turn them back into a big pile of mud. We have the shop to complete, it's second story that will be a classroom, and a big house at the base in Mansoa for McHargues to move into. When everything is working perfectly we can make about 1,000 blocks a day, and we still need to make and lay another 5,000 blocks on the shop's second story and at least 20,000 more for the house in Mansoa. our work cut out for us, but great equipment, a team that's learning, and a big God!

Getting Ready for an Empty Nest by Emily

Starting in May Ajuda Bajuda will have an empty nest here in Bissau. The goal of the project is that after about year of work and training each woman would have enough money saved in her matching fund to start her own business. This ministry was started last March, so this is our first group of women to complete the program.

Each of the 6 women that I'm currently working with are getting their own businesses going and by the end of April they'll all be on their own. It's a super-exciting time for all of us and a superbusy time for me! In addition to the weekly training meetings and managing all of the production, I've started meeting with each woman individually to work on their business plans. Most of the women are planning on using their savings money to open little shops -some selling food, one selling used clothes,

one selling cement by a construction company, and another selling hair extensions and hair braiding services.

Polly is hoping to get a group of women going in Dakar this summer and then I might start another group here in Bissau in 2011. In the mean time I'm going to be working with the English department developing a teacher training program to crank out some more English teachers.
