God heard your prayers for our container and I am happy to report that arrived in port safely, the taxes that they charged were fair, it was released from port in about a month (amazingly fast for Guinea-Bissau), it was unloaded in about four hours without any injuries, and everything inside it looks great!

The main reason we sent this container over was to bring all of the equipment for the solar system that is going to provide power for the entire Youth Center. We also sent over equipment for the classes and the office at the Youth Center, new machines for the shop, and several other missionaries sent things for their families and their ministries. Thank you to everyone who gave generously to make this container a possibility!
